KORANET Workshop on Co-operation Policy Foresight June 7 – 8th, 2010

Aims of the Workshop:

- On the **first day**, European and Korean experts will provide insights into existing cooperation patterns between Korea and the EU. A wrap-up of the analytical results from WP1 and WP2 will be presented.
Target groups of the first day: All KORANET partners (consortium members, steering board members, observers), invited experts – **public welcome**.
- The objective during the **second day** is to help identify the drivers that shape the future S&T co-operation between the EU and Korea. The focus of this exercise should be on key sectors (such as life sciences) and the role of different structures of the S&T systems (in terms of funding instruments, priority setting, structure of R&D institutes, etc.). Based on the results and inputs of these two days a **consultation paper** and a **joint action plan** for KORANET should be drafted.
